A Shared Vision for Blanco

Establish a Planning Committee

The first step is to form a planning committee comprising representatives from various sectors of the community, including residents, business owners, elected officials, and community leaders. This committee will oversee the planning process, make key decisions, and ensure that the plan reflects the diverse perspectives and needs of the community.

Community Assessment & Engaging the Community

Community engagement is a critical aspect of creating a successful comprehensive plan. It is essential to involve residents, businesses, and other stakeholders throughout the planning process to ensure that the plan reflects their needs and aspirations. The community assessment gathers data on various aspects of the town, demographics, land use, housing, transportation, economic conditions, environmental resources, and community facilities. A Community S.W.O.T analysis should be conducted identifying strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats.

Develop A Shared Community Vision

Based on the community assessment, the planning committee should work with the community to develop a shared vision for the future of the town. This vision should articulate the community's desired goals and aspirations.

March 2025 Update Blanco was recently awarded a General Land Office grant to provide funding for the 2025 Comprehensive Master Plan.

Once the community vision is established, the planning committee working group should translate it into specific goals and objectives. These goals and objectives should be measurable, achievable, and time-bound, providing a framework for ensuring the plan's implementation and progress.

For each goal and objective, the planning committee should develop strategies and actions to achieve them. These strategies and actions should be specific, realistic, and feasible, considering the town's resources and constraints.

The final step is to compile all the information gathered and decisions made into a comprehensive plan document. This document should be well-organized, clearly written, and visually appealing. It should also include maps, charts, and other graphics to illustrate the plan's key components and strategies.

Once the plan document is prepared, it will be presented to the city council for adoption. Once adopted, the plan becomes the official policy document guiding Blanco's growth and development. The planning committee should then work with city staff and other stakeholders to implement the plan's strategies and actions.






Economic Development

Implement strategies to attract new businesses to Blanco, enhancing local commerce.






Workforce Development

Establishing a Community Vision


The first step in the planning process is to establish a clear community vision. This vision serves as a guiding principle for setting goals and objectives that align with community values and aspirations.

1 Present the Plan to the City Council




